CAIT & END VIOLENCE EVERYWHERE (EVE): A NATIONWIDE MOVEMENT TO REFORM THE JUSTICE SYSTEM

Canada, January 16, 2025 - End Violence Everywhere (EVE), led by advocate and artist Cait Alexander, is proud to announce significant progress in the fight to reform the justice system and secure justice for survivors of violence. Over the past year, Cait Alexander and the EVE team have engaged with more than 40 politicians across the country, building momentum for transformative change that will prioritize survivors' rights and safety.

Phase 3 of the Ontario Standing Committee on Justice commenced this month and survivors from all over Ontario spoke. There were certain restrictions and shortened time frames, but we want the government to know the work now needs to result in concrete action.

We will work through the pending federal and provincial levels. There is nothing we cannot survive..

A Nationwide Commitment to Change

"Our justice system has consistently failed survivors of violence, but that stops now," said Cait Alexander, founder of EVE, "After meeting with leaders from coast to coast in all levels of government, I am more convinced than ever that reform is not only necessary but within our reach. We are dedicated to doing whatever it takes to provide survivors with the justice they deserve."

These meetings have laid the groundwork for policy reforms that will address systemic failures, including:

- Enhanced support for survivors navigating the justice system.
- Reforms to prevent coercive control and parental alienation from being weaponized in family courts.

- Greater accountability for abusers.
- Expanded access to the trauma-informed legal and therapeutic resources

Exciting Fundraisers to Drive Change

To continue funding these critical efforts, EVE is launching a series of inspiring and impactful fundraisers in 2025, with the first being a High Tea Fundraiser on April 6th 2025 at the Shangri-La Hotel in downtown Toronto. These events will not only raise key funds but also bring communities together to amplify awareness and empower survivors. Details about these events will be announced in the coming weeks.

A Promise to Survivors

EVE's mission is clear: to create a justice system that truly serves survivors: "We are not afraid to confront systemic barriers or challenge outdated practices," said Alexander. "Our commitment is to the survivors, and we promise to fight for them until justice is not just an ideal, but a reality."
